FADA Radios of Yestervear

Gone, but not forgotten

Bronx-born Frank Angelo D'Andrea (FADA) was the creator of radios bearing his initials. He formed a radio company with his 16-year old brother with a goal of getting rich. As the radio boom of 1921 began,

FADA manufactured crystal detectors at a frantic rate. Around 1923, FADA started making radios and added employees at its Bronx, New York plant. With rapid growth, employee relationships suffered, key employees left the firm, strikes happened, and the company fell apart, filing for bankruptcy in 1934.

The company was revived by D'Andrea and later continued by his son Andrea Jr. and his daughter Camille following his death in 1965. Today, FADA radios are well-known and desired by radio collectors because of their fabulous designs that featured metal trims and plastics.
